The Gloucester Charities Trust has a long history of providing affordable housing and practical assistance to older people in Gloucestershire. The Trust also manages a residential home, a nursing home and a day service, all of which help to create a seamless approach to supporting local people to live full and independent lives, both in their own homes and, if the need arises, in one of our specialist facilities.

## OUR AIM

At The Gloucester Charities Trust we understand how important it is to feel settled and secure in later years of life and our aim is to make life a little easier by offering a range of high quality support services, all of which can be tailored to meet individual needs. We manage 133 self-contained retirement flats at 4 sites across the city, along with Magdalen House, our Nursing Home and Guild House, our residential facility.

At The Kimbrose Club, we provide a day service for older people with memory loss or dementia, completing what we call our 'circle of care' philosophy for the needs of local people. The Monday Club caters for more independent older people looking to meet in a safe social environment.

The Kimbrose Club is a warm and welcoming facility that provides a high quality person/ relationship centred day care for older people living with dementia, anxiety, depression or other mental health issues and also offers a range of services to support the carers of its Club Members.

The Kimbrose Club is located near the city centre on main bus routes (10 & 94) and with the railway station and the M5 motorway close by.

We operate an open referral process; we also accept direct referrals from individuals, families, health and social care services.

## What can you expect at The Kimbrose Club?

We want our members to enjoy their time at the Club and we offer a wide range of occupation and group activities as well as one-to-one support.

The activities undertaken at the Club promote the maintenance and improvement of daily living skills and have a high staff to club member ratio.

Facilities include a cosy reminiscence lounge, a fully functioning kitchen for Club Members to utilise, a hair salon & pamper room which will offer such services as hairdressing, chiropody, Indian head massage therapy and other holistic treatments.

The Club has a spacious lounge with dining areas and ample room in which to undertake a wide variety of activities. The Club also has access to a good sized, flat, fully enclosed garden.



## Meals

We provide morning and afternoon refreshments and a delicious, high quality home cooked meal at lunchtime made with fresh, locally sourced ingredients. We cater for a range of individual dietary needs and requests.

## Staff

We have a lively and dedicated team of highly trained staff to meet the unique needs of each individual—nothing is too much trouble.
